Editorial

board toppers. BITS had its moment of glory when Prof. L.K. Maheshwari received the **TECH@EDU award** from EFY for excellence in technology adoption in the education sector for the year 2009.

Among other highlights of the semester that just ticked by a major project worth Rs. 80 Lakhs was granted to Prof. S.B. Mishra on "Support for Entrepreneurial and Managerial Development of SMEs through Incubators" sponsored and supported by the Office of The Development Commissioner, Department of Micro Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME), Govt. of India, New Delhi. This Business Incubation Project is for one year at the first instance for promoting ten business

proposals towards commercialization. The project is of on-going nature and will continue for a long time subject to its successful implementation for which BITS Pilani has been selected as one of the nodal centres for promoting small and medium enterprise (SME) along with 48 reputed institutes/ universities of the country.

As the semester kept sailing, the institute was honoured for having provided maximum number of voluntary blood donors amongst educational institutions of the country during 2008-09 on 1 October 2009. The award was given by the Indian Red Cross Society at the headquarters in New Delhi.

As always, this semester also our students kept bringing laurels to the institute by winning prestigious prizes in various competitions. To name one in the list is Ms. Neha Gupta, a PhD student in the Physics Group at BITS Pilani who won the Best Young Scientist Award for Poster Presentation at the 8th National Conference on Solid State Ionics Materials for Novel Devices held at Dr. Hari Singh Gaur University, Sagar, MP during 7-9 December 2009. The Award was presented by Prof Suresh Chandra, President of the Indian Solid State Ionics Society at H S G University, Sagar on 9 December 2009. Besides, a group of three students- Aayush Deora (2006C7PS804), Anirudh Mandhana (2006B3A8660), and Gaurav Shahlot (2006B5A7498), were awarded the Youth Business Development 2009 Winner Award for Social Start-up 'Ahvaan' during the YBD 2009 at Said Business School (Oxford University) on 13 September 2009. The prize money was £1000.

This semester also witnessed a perfect instance of flexibility for which BITS is known. Alam Ali Khan, a student who had to discontinue his studies due to some unavoidable circumstances, could complete his degree after thirty years.

VISION 2020: MISSION 2012

During the first semester 2009-10, the Steering Committee made significant progress as it started achieving the goals of Mission 2012 which stemmed from Vision 2020. This Steering Team comprised six stalwarts from all the four campuses of the institute Prof. M. Ramachandran, Prof. K.E. Raman, Prof. V.S. Rao, Prof. G. Raghurama, Prof. R.K. Seminars / Conferences / Workshops / Training Programmes...

Workshop on Short Filmmaking (14-20 August 2009)

A seven-day lecture series cum workshop on "Short Filmmaking" was organized by the Languages Group from 14 to 20 August 2009. The workshop was coordinated by Dr. Geetha. B., the instructor- in charge of the course BITS C395: Short Film and Video Production. The resource person for the workshop was the promising young filmmaker Mr. Abhaya Simha G. A., a post graduate diploma



holder from the world-renowned Film and Television Institute of India (FTII), Pune. The workshop included both the theoretical aspects of film making and hands-on experience. It covered topics ranging from 'Why Make Films', Story and Script writing for Films, fundamentals of Camera and Cinematography, and Basics of Sound to the final Post Production stage. The workshop culminated in the production of a short fiction film 'Azaadi'. As a part of the workshop, film viewing sessions were also organized. This workshop was a part of the recently introduced elective course on 'Short Film and Video Production'.

A three-day international conference on Advances in Concrete, Structural and Geotechnical Engineering was held in BITS, Pilani by the Civil Engineering



Group. The Convener of the Conference, Prof. Samsher Bahadur Singh (Group Leader, Civil Engineering, BITS) welcomed the guests and highlighted the theme of the conference. He further remarked that the recent advances in concrete science, structural and geotechnical materials, computational and experimental techniques, gradual diffusion of many interdisciplinary areas with structural mechanics as well as geotechnical engineering have nearly revolutionized. Therefore, there is an urgent need for the researchers and the participating engineers working in the broad field of concrete technology, structural and geotechnical engineering, to keep abreast of the latest trends and developments in these fields with the aim of updating their analytical and practical skills. On this occasion, Prof. G.
