A Confluence of Ideas

Seminars and Conferences

Seminar on Entrepreneurship Culture: Issues and Challenges of Small and Intermediate Entrepreneurs at Grassroots Level

The Humanistic Studies Group and the Centre for Entrepreneurial Leadership, BITS, Pilani organised a National Seminar on Entrepreneurship Culture: Issues and Challenges of Small and Intermediate Entrepreneurs at Grassroots Level during 2-4 September, 2005. Attended by about 85 delegates the seminar stressed the need for institutes to equip students with innovative and analytical skills and also to lay emphasis on entrepreneurship in their curriculum. Participants from various institutes like NABARD and SIDBI and the Ministry of Small Scale Industries, Govt. of India participated in the conference.



National Conference on Energy Management in Changing Business Scenario

The Centre for Renewable Energy and Environment Development (CREED) organised a two day national conference on **Energy Management in Changing Business Scenario** (EMCBS-2005) during 8-9 October, 2005 with a view to exchange various ideas regarding planning, optimisation, integration and management of conventional and renewable energy technologies and discuss the changing regimes in the management of energy.



The conference was sponsored by Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), Department of Science and Technology (DST), Indian Renewable Development Agency Ltd. (IREDA), Ministry of Non Conventional Energy Sources (MNES), New Delhi, Tata BP Solar, Bangalore and Energy & Fuel Users Association of India, (ENFUSE), Chennai.

More than seventy delegates comprising academicians, researchers, energy planners and representatives from various industries across the nation presented their scholarly papers.

National Symposium on Recent Trends in Physics

The Physics Group, BITS, Pilani, organised a two-day National Symposium during 4-5 November 2005 to mark the centennial of the publication of the three classic papers on Special Relativity, Brownian motion and Photoelectric effect by Albert Einstein. Prof. L. K. Maheshwari inaugurated the symposium and stressed the need for such conferences to attract young people to undertake their studies in basic sciences. Dr. Chandrasekhar, Director CEERI delivered the key note address on VLSI Design, an upcoming field in interdisciplinary studies.



Attracting an overwhelming response from an enthusiastic audience comprising students and faculty, Dr. H.C. Verma, Prof., IIT Kanpur and noted Physicist conducted a lecture demonstration on teaching Physics effectively through simple experiments.



Workshops

Workshop on Professional Effectiveness

The Economics & Finance Group and the Management Group jointly organised a two-day programme on *Professional Effectiveness* during 20-21 August, 2005 for the benefit of various Heads of schools in Pilani. Twenty nine participants, including Principals, Vice Principals and Heads of departments, attended the programme. With its focus on creating an awareness among the participants about the requisite skills that can help in improving their professional effectiveness, the programme covered a range of topics related to today's challenging educational environment.

Workshop on the Safety of Rural Roads

Aimed at emphasizing the importance of road user education as well as of the proper legal assistance for accident victims, the workshop was conducted in collaboration with the International Forum for Rural Transport and Development (IFRTD) on 12 September 2005.



Delegates from various countries such as Bangladesh, Cambodia, China, India, Indonesia, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka participated in the workshop. With Dr. P.K. Nanda, Director, Central Roads Research Institute (CRRI), New Delhi as the chief guest, the workshop witnessed significant contribution from Central Road and the National Rural Road Development agency, New Delhi.

4th Asia Regional Meeting

The Annual Regional Meeting (ARM 2005) of the International Forum Group for Rural Transport and Development (IFRTD) was organized and convened by Prof. A. K. Sarkar during 13-15 September, 2005. Representatives from Bangladesh, Cambodia, China, India, Indonesia, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka participated in the meeting.



The deliberations mainly focused on Rural Road Safety issues covering Road Engineering, Signage, Vehicle Design, Education of Road Users, Enforcement of Traffic Safety Measures, etc., on a holistic basis.

Workshop on Project Formulation and Quality Monitoring under PMGSY



The workshop conducted on 8 September, 2005 attracted participants from National Rural Road Development Agency (NRRDA), officials from the Ministry of Rural Development, Govt. of India, and the Public Works Department of Rajasthan, Haryana and Punjab, and also faculty from BITS, Pilani. The main focus of the workshop was on Road Design, Optimisation and Testing, which are indubitably important to ensure that Rural Road Development Projects are well formulated, evaluated and implemented with Total Quality embedded from Concept to Commissioning.

Training Programmes

PMGSY Training Programme for PWD Engineers

Sponsored by National Rural Roads Development Agency (NRRDA), four training programmes (each of six-day duration) were organized under Prime Minister Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) during



October-December 2005. These training programmes were conducted for the Assistant Engineers and Junior Engineers of Rajasthan. About 35 participants attended each programme.

Three more programmes have been scheduled to be held during January-March, 2006.





UGC Refresher Course on Manufacturing Excellence

Under the aegis of University Grants Commission, the Mechanical Engineering Group of the institute organized a three-week refresher programme on Manufacturing Excellence during 12-31 December 2005.

Organic Chemistry Lab

Inaugurated by the Vice Chancellor on 14 December 2005, the renovated organic chemistry laboratory is equipped with new working tables having jet-black granite top which are resistant to chemical attacks. Four state-of-the-art fume cupboards have been installed for the purpose of performing hazardous reactions. Now, the laboratory has the minor equipments and apparatus such as Buchi rotary vacuum evaporators, high vacuum ovens, hot air ovens, digital automatic melting point apparatus, microwave oven, uv-visible chamber, digital balances, and low temperature storage facilities. This will be an important facility for all the courses and research work involving synthetic organic chemistry of chemistry and pharmacy groups.



Penguin Book Festival, 8-20 November 2005

The Penguin Book Festival was held at the Akshay Supermarket on 8-20 November 2005 in association with Penguin India. It provided an opportunity for the faculty and students to browse through and buy the latest Penguin titles. Over 2000 Penguin books covering the subjects such as Fiction, Literature, History, Biography, Management, General Reading, General Reference and Children's books were made available at the Book Festival.



JOINING HANDS

The Centre for Desert Development Technologies C-DDT has joined hands with Jacob Blaustein Institute for Desert Research BIDR Negev Israel. In addition to adaptation, codevelopment and deployment of iLabs, iMOAT and xTutor for its own students as well as helping several other interested institutions of higher learning in the country to use these resources, BITS-Pilani shall carry out joint collaborative research with researchers at MIT under the broad agreement between the two institutions. MIT shall also be provided access to the e-learning technology developed by BITS-Pilani in the process. CSD shall be the principal research laboratory involved in the process. students drawn from various national-level institutions after a rigorous selection process, cover the tuition and living expenses of the students for the entire duration of their programme of studies.

The Mobile Medics Team consisting of Sriram Gutta, Kavikrut, Srikanth PNV, Amit H Mirchandani and Rajashekhar MV has reached many milestones with their business plan-Jana Swasthya Rakshak. After winning the first prizes at both Conquest 2005 at BITS, Pilani (March 2005) and the Outrageous Business Plan Competition at Columbia Business School (April 2005) the team participated in Bzzwings 2005, the annual business plan competition at IIM Bangalore's annual management festival—Vista 2005.

With the team winning Rs.3 lacs as prize money, the plan was judged second while IIM Ahmadabad secured the first. On 15 December 2005, the team was honoured for its achievements by the National Entrepreneurship Network & Wadhwani Foundation at TIECon 2005, India's largest Conference on Entrepreneurship.

Global 30 under 30 Awards




