A REPORT

Four Day National Webinar

Background

The COVID-19 pandemic has forced the academic institutions to physically shut down and move to online operations. The libraries of these institutions are therefore facing hard choices. Majority of libraries of these institutes majorly have print collections and have minimal access to e-collections. Such institutes have difficulty in serving their users in this crisis. As teaching-learning moves online the academic libraries too should have a virtual presence and thus remain relevant to their parent institutions. Library professionals can avail this opportunity to transform their libraries into hybrid libraries with strong e-collection to serve at any time.

Objectives

Based on the background, the librarians conceived the idea of organising a webinar which would offer practical suggestions to LIS professionals to create a hybrid library which can serve their users remotely. The objectives of the webinar were identified as

- ✚ To support academic library professionals to avail this opportunity to transform their libraries into hybrid libraries with strong e-collection to serve at any time.
- ✚ To reach out to academic Libraries of various sizes across various geographical locations at a national level.

Planning

After chalking out the objectives, the Library heads of both the institutes Mrs. Madhavi Wadkar, Senior Librarian, Institute of Chemical Technology, Mumbai and Dr. Meghana Sanjeeva, Librarian, VES College of Arts, Science and Commerce approached their respective institution heads Prof. Pandit and Dr. Anita Kanwar. Initiation of collaboration for webinars had been established between the two institutes with the successful conduct of the first webinar on **Copyright: Concerns and Challenges for Online Education**. Both the institutional heads accepted this idea of the organizing of the webinar and more importantly wholeheartedly supported the collaboration between the two academic institutes.

Since the theme of the webinar was one which required a large spectrum of areas to be covered, the organizers deemed it necessary to have an advisory committee for the planning of the webinar. A five-member Advisory Committee was constituted and the theme and subtopics were crystallised with the able guidance of the committee.

Four-day programme on **Rethinking and Recreating the Academic Library: Lessons from the Pandemic** was planned in a step wise manner beginning from e-collection development to e-services keeping in mind the needs of the users of the present generation and the situation. The webinar was planned from **22nd July 2020 to 25th July 2020**.

A meeting of the panellists and the moderators was also conducted on 20th July 2020 to fine tune and sharpen the focus of the panel discussions, which was planned as a concluding session of the webinar which would help the participants to derive best possible from the sessions.

The platform to be used for the webinar was fixed as Streamyard and trial sessions for all the speakers were arranged on 21st July 2020 in two slots for the convenience of speakers.

This webinar was designed keeping in mind the need of the hour for Library and Information Science Professionals serving the academic institutes to help them build e-collections and to serve their users. The planning of webinar and the deliberations would help librarians find new opportunities amidst these adversities.

Platform Used

The sessions were conducted online using Streamyard while the live streaming was made available at YouTube. The schedule of the webinar was as presented below



Rethinking and Recreating the Academic Library: Lessons from Pandemic


Prof. Ramesh Gaur


The focus of the first day was on building e-collections which form the base for the services in the academic library.

e-Collection development: ebooks & ejournals


Mrs. Madhavi Wadkar


e-Resources Licensing: What we need to know




E-Services for Academic Libraries




Research Support Services & Tools



Role of INFLIBNET in development of Academic Libraries






Skills and Competencies for Academic Librarians

Raise User Experience (UX) to Excel in Academic Libraries






Our Panel discussion on


'Near Future of the Academic Libraries' which was moderated by Dr. Medha Joshi having four panellists, focusing on vital dimension namely collection, users, services and training to LIS professionals at SHPT School of Library Science.

- ✚ Dr Shivanand emphasized on scrutinizing e-collections before acquisition depending on the requirements of the parent institutions. He also reiterated the need for negotiations with vendors for e-content. He urged the college librarians to use the NLIST content extended by INFLIBNET as it had many resources to meet the requirements of colleges.
- ✚ Dr Durga Murari elucidated the changing user needs coupled with the physical closure of libraries. She emphasised the need to curate more e-resources for undergraduate students in regional languages. She also highlighted the use of NDLI which served as a very important resource for all.
- ✚ Dr Sunita Barve shaped the session with her focused inputs on services in academic libraries with emphasis on open access tools.
- ✚ Dr Parul Zaveri explicated the consistent revisions of LIS curriculum and focused efforts taken by SHPT School of Library Science with changes in the field and inputs from practicing librarians.






Participation & Feedback


