EDITORIAL

The Second Semester, 2009-10 witnessed BITS, Pilani marching ahead with myriad of developments on every front. Keeping in with the quintessentially eventful ambience of the campus, significant and variegated events kept unfolding and thrilling us as the days progressed.



The Institute gave a memorable farewell to Prof. L.K. Maheshwari, a man of extraordinary vision and acumen, who completed his term as the Vice Chancellor of the Institute and handed over the baton to Prof. Bijendra Nath Jain. Prof. LKM's association with BITS dates back to his student days when he joined the M.Sc. (Tech.) Program at BITS and later on pursued his doctorate from the Institute. For the next four decades, Prof. Maheshwari kept guiding and leading BITS in various capacities until he retired as its Vice-Chancellor on July 31, 2010. The Institute will continue to be benefited by his vision and guidance as Professor Emeritus and Advisor.

The semester also saw Prof. G. Raghurama taking over as the Director of the Institute and Prof. R.N. Saha as Deputy Director (Research & Educational Development and Administration) and Prof. G. Sundar as Deputy Director (Off-Campus Programs) respectively. Meanwhile, Prof. R.K. Mittal took over as the Director of BITS, Pilani – Dubai Campus.

Besides these happy tidings, the semester also saw the fraternity of BITS losing one of their most distinguished custodians in the passing away of Prof. S. Venkateswaran, the erstwhile Vice-Chancellor of BITS, Pilani on 15 May 2010.

Among other highlights of the semester, BITS, Pilani had the honour of playing host to Prof. Douglas Osheroff, winner of Nobel Prize in Physics in 1996 and presently, Professor at Stanford University, US. He delivered a lecture

entitled "Scientific Discovery: a Nobel Laureate's Experiences" on 14 February 2010. The semester also witnessed several other talks by distinguished experts, conferences and seminars.

That research at BITS has also taken a big stride forward, got evidenced as Dr. Raj Kumar Gupta, Physics Group, secured a prestigious project on Development of Surface Plasmon Resonance Instrument with a Novel Optical Design worth Rs. 25 lakhs. This will surely provide a fresh impetus to research drives across the institute.

Like the preceding years, the students of the Institute kept on bringing us more laurels as AcYut 2 and AcYut 3 developed by students of BITS Pilani (Sushma Vallabhaneni (Team Leader), Akash Gupta, Tushar Agrawal, Ankit Kulshrestha, Rohan Maheshwari and Viveka Nopani), won four medals in Robogames held at San Mateo Fairgrounds, California, US during 23-25 April 2010.

The semester was rounded off in greater enthusiastic fervour as the institute's eminence burgeoned further with a staggering number of 1,39,234 applications being received for BITSAT 2010 for a total of 2000 seats. The fact that this year as many as 21 All India Board Toppers have sought admission under the scheme of Direct



Admission to Board Toppers further underlines the growing popularity of the institute. The semester also vouchsafed the institute making a robust march towards translating the ideas put forth by various task forces formed under the Mission 2012 into reality. Now for taking the institute further on to a more enterprising voyage in pursuit of further excellence and innovations, both the faculty and the students are keen to stride further under the seasoned leadership of new Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Bijendra Nath Jain and the dynamic stewardship of Prof. G. Raghurama, Director, BITS, Pilani - Pilani Campus.

New Vice Chancellor at BITS



Professor Bijendra Nath Jain has taken over as the new Vice Chancellor of BITS, Pilani on 01 August 2010. Professor Jain obtained B.Tech. from IIT Kanpur and Ph.D. from SUNY, Stony Brook (NY), both in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science. Since 1975 he had been with IIT Delhi, where he was Professor of Computer Science. Earlier at IIT Delhi, he has been a Microsoft Chair Professor, Head of the Department, Dean Alumni Affairs, and Deputy Director (Faculty Affairs).

Prof. Jain has held various visiting assignments with Universities of Texas and Maryland, Bell Labs, and Cisco Systems. Most recently, he has been a Gledden Senior Visiting Fellow at University of Western Australia, Perth.

His teaching and research interests are in Computer Networks and Systems, with applications to wireless networks, environment monitoring and information security. Over the last 35 years, Prof. Jain has trained over 2500 computer communication specialists, many of whom are leaders in R&D in India and abroad, including those in government and industry.

Other than authoring a large number of research papers for international journals and for conferences of repute, he has co-authored the book "OSI: Its Architecture and Protocols" published in 1993 by McGraw Hill, New York, and translated into Japanese by Soft Research. Prof. Jain is also a co-inventor, with researchers from Cisco Systems in seven US patents.

In 1983, Prof. Jain was the first to propose a nation-wide data network for India. With funding from Government of India and UNDP, and together with developers from other institutions in India, he built and launched in 1989 India's first data network, ERNet. Today, ERNet is a thriving not-for-profit company connecting over a million users spread across over 2000 institutions in India.

Prof. Jain has helped several organizations in

REC, IA, PNB, NTPC, NDDB, UNICEF, and (most recently) Customs & Excise Department. He is also a member of several committees, including DRDO's Naval Research Board, Technology Assessment Board of Microsoft Research, and Board of Governors of IIT Delhi.

Prof. Jain is also a Co-Founder and had been Chairman of Kritikal Solutions, a technology startup focused on computer vision, embedded systems and networks.

With his vast experience, profound vision and sharp acumen, Prof. Jain is all set to take the institute to greater height of growth and glory.

A Memorable felicitation to an Accomplished VC

Prof. L.K. Maheshwari, the man of extraordinary vision and legendary personality, completed his term as Vice-Chancellor of BITS on 31 July 2010 and handed over the responsibilities of Vice chancellorship to Prof. Bijendra Nath Jain. Prof. L.K. Maheshwari, fondly called *LKM Sir* by his students, served BITS for about 40 years in various capacities and added many feathers to its cap. He came to Pilani as a student at the age of 20 in 1965 and completed his M.Sc. (Tech.) and his Ph.D. degrees in 1965 and 1971 respectively. He commenced his career as a Lecturer in EEE Group in 1971 and became a Professor in 1982.

































Prof. LKM is a teacher of rare caliber. One rarely comes across a gifted teacher and administrator like him who is popular among students and fellow colleagues alike. Quiet, modest and committed to his profession, he could win over the hearts of his students and staff alike. Driven by passion and enthusiasm, he transformed challenges into opportunities. He brought the moment of glory to the institute when he received TECH@EDU award from EFY for excellence in technology adoption in the education sector for the year 2009. Besides this, Prof. LKM received 'Scientist of the Year' award in 1995 from Gian Chand Jain Memorial Foundation, Ambala for contributions in education, research, and university-industry linkage programmes and in 2007 he was bestowed upon the 'Science Councillor Award - 2007' from Indian Society of Health, Environment, Education and Research (ISHEER), Jodhpur Centre, India. Prof. LKM has also been a Fellow of Institution of Electronics & Telecommunication Engineers (India), Member of IEEE, USA and WACE, USA.

In his tenure, Prof. LKM engineered several new collaborative programmes and signed MoUs with various industries and organizations within the country and abroad, besides introducing several remarkable innovations in teaching and research.

BITS, Pilani where he put in four decades of distinguished and dedicated services, reciprocated with unequivocal admiration from all. On his retirement therefore, Prof. Maheshwari was given a very emotional and memorable send-off. The institute honored Prof. L.K. Maheshwari at the grand finale of the felicitation ceremony on 4 August 2010 in the auditorium of BITS, Pilani. It commenced with a video show enumerating the highlights of Prof. L.K. Maheshwari's professional attainments.

Staff Association of BITS, Pilani felicitated Prof. L.K. Maheshwari on 04 August 2010. The executive committee of the staff association presented an antique statue of Lord Buddha which was a true admiration of his amazing patience and effable nature.

In the 156th Senate meeting also Prof. Maheshwari was honoured and a few senior members conveyed their heartfelt feelings.

His love for the institute is reflected in the Foundation instituted by him with the cooperation of his family members. **Professor L.K.**Maheshwari Foundation, Pilani will be proudly owned by students and faculty of EEE & Instrumentation groups of BITS, Pilani to further its activities. Dr. Chandrashekhar, the alumnus, BITS, Pilani and Director, CEERI, Pilani is the first recipient of the award. Prof. L.K. Maheswari



honoured Dr. Chandrashekhar with Citation, Memento of Distinguished Alumnus Award and a shawl. Dr. Chandrashekhar accepted the honour with utmost humility and expressed his heartfelt gratitude towards the Trust for his selection. Prof. L.K. Maheshwari being a man with incredible intellect and vision encouraged both the students and staff and brought out several changes and flexibilities in academics and research of the institute.

Vision 2020: Mission 2012

During the second semester 2009-10 the Steering Committee has vigorously made significant progress as it kept achieving the goals of Mission 2012 which stemmed from Vision 2020.

The 'Mission 2012' project picked momentum during the semester and the task forces have put into action many of the progressive ideas.

In the area of academic programs and pedagogy, a thorough review of existing curriculum through a benchmarking exercise has been conducted. The outcomes are being consolidated and will be shared with the faculty and students. Academic and career counseling is being strengthened by the formation of Academic Counseling Cells in all campuses. A first-of-the-kind 'engagement survey' has been initiated with the help of a leading management research firm to assess the level of faculty, student, staff engagement in BITS and also to help in identifying areas for focus. An ERP for managing the multi-campus environment is being put in place. A new office of Alumni Affairs Division has been formed and an Alumni Affairs Cell has been setup in each campus for better coordination of alumni related activities. New staff positions (such as CPO, CFO) have been created for effective administration. Energy saving drive, advanced student feedback mechanism, and improved policies strengthening research etc. are also other areas where considerable work has been done. There is good progress in the area of Infrastructure modernization with a special focus on upgrading the Pilani campus.

A Confluence of Ideas

Seminars / Conferences / Workshops / Training programs

BITS Model United Nations Summit (12 - 14 February 2010)

BITSMUN 2010, held from 12 - 14 February 2010 was a Model United Nations Summit organized by the BITSMUN society of the institute. Over 350 delegates from all over India and abroad deliberated upon various critical global issues, grappled with complex crises, and produced imaginative solutions. Participants included 15 delegates from UK, Japan, Australia and Sri Lanka, twelve of whom obtained complete travel sponsorship through BITSMUN. **BITSMUN** simulated 6 organs of the UN namely- The Security Council, Human Rights Council, United Nations Environment Program General Assembly, Economic and Social Council and Commission on Science and Technology for Development. On this occasion, BITSMUN also organized a lecture by the Nobel Laureate for Physics- Prof Douglas Osheroff on 14 February 2010 on Scientific Discovery: A Nobel Laureate's Experiences. At the end of the conference, awards worth INR 1.5 lakhs were given to the best delegates. The participants deliberated on issues such as combating violence, transfer of green technology to developing nations, road after Copenhangen Environment Summit, combating food security, effective implementation of Millennium Development Goals etc. The conference also featured Delegate



Banquet where delegates were able to socialize and build network for future development. Some notable delegates included Moeko 'best delegate awardee' of the Japan MUN, Steven Cox- British Representative to the Harry Messel International SS Conference, Australia 2009, Kenta- who in addition to MUNs, follows a passionate hobby by working part time as a professional Japanese magician, and Nine delegates from Sri Lanka, all winners of the Colombo MUN. The Faculty-incharge for the event, Prof N V Muralidhar Rao,

Dean, Engineering Hardware Division appreciated BITSMUN for helping the students understand the functioning of the international organizations in general and UN and its initiatives in particular. The event was sponsored by Steel Authority of India, Yahoo, British Council, Opera Software and Myntra and worked in association with over a dozen social NGOs.

National Conference on Green and Sustainable Chemistry (19-21 February 2010)

A two-day national conference on *Green and Sustainable Chemistry* was organized at BITS, Pilani on 19 February 2010 by Chemistry Group. Over 200 delegates from all over India involved in green and sustainable chemistry participated in the conference. The Chief Guest, Dr Sudarshan K Arora, President, Research and Development, Ranbaxy Research Laboratories, said that nature is the biggest innovator and chemist whereas mankind is associated with hazardous and toxic materials and hence has caused huge damage to



the environment though very unintentionally. On this occasion, Dr Arora also released the book of Abstracts. Delivering the keynote address, Professor Asif K Chakravorti, Professor, National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education Research, Mohali, said that Green Chemistry, Human Welfare and Sustainability are closely linked. Prof G Sundar, Professor of Chemistry said that Green chemistry concerns with eliminating wastage and minimizing the usage of toxic resources. He said that the conference facilitated the exchange of ideas and develop partnerships between the academic people and industries. Dr Dalip Kumar, Group Leader, Chemistry Group, explained the activities of the Chemistry Group at BITS. Prof Sivasubramanian, Professor of Chemistry, proposed the vote of thanks.

Empowering Women in Developing Countries through Better Healthcare and Nutrition (22-24 April 2010)

A three-day International Conference on Empowering Women in Developing Countries through Better Healthcare and Nutrition was



organised during 22-24 April 2010 by the Women Studies & Societal Development Unit, BITS, Pilani jointly with the Centre for Science & Technology of the Non-Aligned and Other Developing Countries (NAM S&T Centre). The Conference was supported by the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), Rajasthan and was attended by senior health professionals, policy makers, academicians, gender experts from India, nonother developing aligned and countries. Delegates from 18 countries. including Cambodia, Egypt, Zimbabwe, Indonesia, Iran. Kenya, Malaysia, Mauritius, Mexico, Myanmar, Nigeria, Oman, Russia, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Syria, Tanzania and Uganda participated in the The conference aimed at critically examining the healthcare risks faced by women of child-bearing age in developing countries, such as India and particularly in the state of Rajasthan; and identifying the areas of weaknesses. obstacles and challenges in providing adequate healthcare and nutrition to women.

Prof. L.K. Maheshwari, Vice Chancellor, BITS, Pilani welcomed the delegates and highlighted the initiatives taken by BITS, Pilani towards empowerment of communities including women especially at the local grass root level. The Convenor of the conference and the Chief, Women Studies & Societal Development Unit BITS, Pilani, Prof. Nirupama Prakash introduced the theme of the Conference. Prof. Arun Kulshreshtha, Director, NAM S&T Centre spoke about the key aspects of Nam S&T Centre and its involvement in organizing events on scientific & social issues. Dr. Padmanaban, Advisor, National Health Systems Resource Centre, National Rural Health Mission, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, New Delhi delivered the inaugural address. Mr. Samuel Mawunganidze, Chief, UNICEF, Rajasthan spoke passionately about building institutions for women and child development. Delegates made country specific presentations on women's health and nutrition. Madam Sajjan Katara, MLA from Udaipur actively participated in the event. Dr. Raj

Kumar Sharma, the Minister of State for Medical and Health, Government of Rajasthan who was nominated by the state government, also participated actively in the conference.

Short Film Making Workshop (5-8 February 2010)

A four- day lecture series cum workshop on *Short Film and Documentary Film Making* was organized by the Languages Group during 5-8 February 2010. The workshop was coordinated by Dr. Geetha. B., the instructor- in-charge of the course BITS C395: Short Film and Video Production. The resource person for the workshop was the National Award Winning filmmaker



Mr. Abhaya Simha G. A., a post graduate diploma holder from the world-renowned Film and Television Institute of India (FTII), Pune. The workshop covered various theoretical aspects of short film and documentary making. It also gave the participants a hands-on experience of making a documentary film by scripting and shooting a small documentary film on BITS Library. The lecture series cum workshop covered topics



ranging from Films and Documentaries, Mise-enscene and Developing the Story, Researching and Scripting for a documentary, Interviewing and Sound recording and Post Production Stage. The workshop was a part of the course on 'Short Film and Video Production'.

Workshop on Intellectual Property Rights (25 April 2010)

Entrepreneurship Development and IPR Unit, BITS Pilani organized a workshop on Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Management on 25 April 2010. National Science Day Celebration (28 February 2010)

The scientific achievement of Sir CV Raman is celebrated as *National Science Day* in the institute every year. On 28 February 1928 the Raman effect was discovered and he was awarded the

Nobel prize for this discovery in 1930. The events of the Science Day celebrations were a science quiz competition for the students of local schools, lecture on Nobel prize winner of 2009 and a "Treasure Hunt" event for the students of BITS, Pilani. Further, to create an interest in science among the school children, the pupils from four schools of Pilani were invited to visit the laboratories of the science groups. Treasure Hunt for BITS students was held on 21 February in which about 150 students participated. Four schools with two teams from each school; with two students in each team from ninth standard to eleventh standard, took part in the science quiz competition: This event was held on 27 February. The quiz session comprised of three rounds: (i) visuals round; (ii) demonstrative round; and (iii) crack the jumble round. The first two teams were awarded prizes. On 28 February, the faculty members from three schools, visited the laboratories of Physics, Chemistry and Biology group, wherein the faculty demonstrated a few experiments and discussed with them about their applications. The laboratory visit of the school children was followed by a short valedictory function. A lecture on Noble Prize Winners in Science, 2009 was delivered by Dr. Shibasish Maheshwari, Prof. L.K. Chowdhury. Chancellor, BITS, Pilani, addressed the gathering and Prof. R. R. Mishra, Group leader of Physics gave away the prizes to the winners of the different events.







These experts also acted as mentors to the participants by sharing with them on-the-job knowledge as well as by answering questions relating to various strategies involved in finance management, etc. The following projects were chosen by the experts for the award of prizes: I Prize - Nano Silica Aggregate Solutions for Recycling in Industries; II Prize - Near Surface Monitoring and Structural Health Monitoring of Structures Repaired with FRP; III Prize - Green Plastics; IV Prize -Eppendorf Cleaner. Another highlight of CEL this semester has been the introduction of a unique

course titled "New Venture Creation" which has been introduced for the benefit of students deeply interested in taking up entrepreneurship as a career option. This course has been launched in association with BITSAA International. One round on experimental basis was steered by Abhinay Khushraj, BITS Alumnus and Strategy & Business Development Manager, Nokia along with Prof Arya Kumar, Chief ED & IPR Unit during the first semester 2009-10 and was found to be an invaluable experience for truly aspiring entrepreneurs. The purpose of this course is not only to study entrepreneurship but also to practice

The technical fest of BITS Pilani, was inaugurated this year by Mrs. Meera Sanyal, M.D., Royal Bank of Scotland along with our Vice Cancellor Prof. L.K. Maheshwari. Mrs. Sanyal gave college and the praised encouragement to continue their good work. In the inauguration, the President of the Student's Union, Sudheer Babu, and the General Secretary, Raghav Mimani expressed their gratitude towards the joint efforts of the clubs and departments who made Apogee 2010 a reality.

The major attractions of the inauguration were Kathak and Bhangra performances which were followed by fireworks. This Apogee had plethora



of events like Air Show, Dirt Bike Racing, TEDx, Fireworks, and many more.

During APOGEE students showcased a good number of projects and paper presentations. The participation from outside colleges was commendable too with a number around 650.

Workshops

Apogee 2010 provided students with ample opportunity to enhance their knowledge in various fields. A large number of workshops were held for students of both BITS, Pilani and outside. The



most notable among them were the Astro workshop and the Origami workshop. The Astro Club of BITS, Pilani held a four-day workshop which included telescope handling. astrophotography, viewing the southern hemisphere using an inflatable dome, a lecture by Dr. S. Pal, renowned scientist of ISRO, and other lectures and sky watching sessions by the members of the club. This workshop saw great participation especially from students of other colleges. The origami workshops, organized by MATRIX proved to be a great success. The workshop was conducted by Hitomi Ashta, the author of books like Origami and More Origami. A workshop on Quantum Information was organized by the Physics group. It was a three-day workshop and dealt with various areas like Quantum Teleportation, Quantum Cryptography Quantum Computation. Other major workshops conducted were X-MechBOT(a Robotics workshop), Cyber Forensics and Ethical Hacking and a workshop on Green Chemistry.

Quizzes

The most famous quiz in Apogee was BOB (Brain of BITS) which was organized by the English Language Activities Society. BOB provide a stage to test one's mettle against the best guizzers on campus. And as every year, BOB lived up to the full expectations of the large number of audience who had come to be a part of this event. BULB and Jeopardy were two more guizzing events, conducted by the Department of Informalz. The Lab quiz, organized by the Biology, Chemistry and Physics Societies was a quiz designed to test the experimental skills of an individual. Another guiz, which gained huge popularity this Apogee, was WHO DUN IT, conducted by the Chemistry group. The most noteworthy thing about this quiz was its participation, which was more than expected. Other major quizzes held were Jeu de Technology, the Journalism quiz, the Messier Marathon, the India Quiz, Fast and Qurious, REBUS, the Mythology Quiz, Over Head Transmission, Physics Challenge, World Wars, and many more.

Online Competitions and Models

Two major online competitions, named *Layers* and *Portfolio*, were organized by the Photography Club. While Portfolio tests the skills at photography, Layers tests the mettle of a participant in post processing of an image. The winning entries were showcased in Panorama, a photography exhibition during Apogee. *Numero Uno* is a combination of case study analysis with an online treasure hunt. Another major competition held was IStructE. The event tested observational skills and also problem (structural problems) solving skills which were the basic

requirements of a structured engineer. Other online competitions held were SMS: Stock Market Simulation, Blog Business, Creativity Quotient Test, Code 2 Play, Qrious and Simu-Quantalate.



The APOGEE participants displayed various models of effective traffic control system, AutoCad design, etc. which got an overwhelming response from viewers.

Guest Lectures

This Apogee witnessed a large number of great lectures organized by the department PEP. A lecture which was received very well was by Archana Sharma, an Indian experimental physicist and a staff member of CERN - European Organization for Nuclear Research since 1987 and presently working on the Compact Muon Solenoid (CMS) experiment at the Large Hadron Collider (LHC) project in Geneva, Switzerland. A very inspiring lecture was given by Meera Sanyal. She is currently the Chairperson and Country Executive for ABN AMRO Bank (now RBS) in India and on the National Advisory Board of AIESEC, an international students' organization.

A lecture which received huge audience was by Satish Jha. Satish Jha is a writer, editor, researcher, international corporate executive, social entrepreneur, an executive coach, mentor and a management consultant with special interest in information technology management. He is currently a Special Adviser to Kofi Annan Centre for Excellence in ICTs, and to several other organizations including UNGAID, Development Gateway of The World Bank and cochairs the World IT Forum (WITFOR). He talked of his dream project "One Laptop per Child". Another lecture was by Dr. A.S. Pillai, a distinguished scientist and Chief Controller, R&D, DRDO and also the CEO and MD of BrahMos Aerospace. He received the Padma Shree award in 2002. This Apogee, students also got to hear R Sukumar, the proud BITSian who hogged the news media by taking up position as Managing Editor of the Mint, one of the largest business newspapers of the country.

TED_X

A very integral part of APOGEE 2010 was TEDx, for Entrepreneurial by Centre Leadership, BITS Pilani. Speakers like Vishal Cleo Pascal and Harish Talreja, Ramakrishnan had come all the way to Pilani to interact with the students. This event was a great success and received huge response from the students. A TED Talk by Ron Eglash, on Ethno-Mathematics has been rated as one of the most jaw-dropping talks ever given. He spoke at length about the need of the day. He argued that who knew 10 years before that mobile phones would



become so common that more than half of the population will own one, but today it has been possible and we are the ones who have made it happen. Similarly now it's the time for another revolution. He described his one laptop per child scheme, wherein he dreams of equipping each with a special laptop, minus sophistications and adding the roughness. He believed that learning and education were different and we need to find the right perspective. He advised the students that it would be better if instead of going for a job, they could create jobs for the world.

The whole event was highly successful and lived up to the expectations of both students and faculty who enjoyed the distinguished talks delivered by high profile speakers.

Apogee came to an end on 14 March 2010, with the Valedictory Ceremony. The function began with Satish Jha, the chief guest, addressing the students. The address was followed by the declaration of winners of the projects and paper presentations and prize distribution for events; the projects were divided into different categories like Automation, Health and Nutrition, Industrial process and application, material sciences, pure sciences, software design etc. The paper presentations were won by Sona College of (chemical, mechanical), Technology University (civil and computer science) BITS Pilani (management and communication systems) and Besides these, the sponsors distributed a hoard of prizes for their events.

NSS

MATRIX


